

Practice with Indirect Statement

Pre-reading, The Road to Corinth (Pausanias 1.44.7-10)

First, become familiar with [words of speaking, thinking, knowing or perceiving](#) that introduce indirect statements.

In the following sentences, identify (a) the main verb of speaking, thinking, or perceiving; (b) the subject of the indirect statement; and (c) the verb of the indirect statement (tense and mood):

α. λόγοι εἰσιν ὡς ἀπὸ ταύτης τῆς πέτρας Ἴνῶ ρίψαι (throw) αὐτὴν ἐς θάλασσαν.

β. λέγεται δὴ καὶ μανέντα δοῦσαι ταῦτα Ἀθάμαντα.

γ. λέγεται δὲ καὶ ὡς ἐς τὴν Ἴνῶ καὶ τοὺς παῖδας χρῆσαιτο (behave, conduct oneself)

ἀκρατεῖ τῷ θυμῷ.

δ. Ἀθάμας αἰσθάνεται βουλευῆσαι ἐπὶ τούτοις πᾶσιν τὴν Ἴνῶ.

ε. τὴν Μολουρίδα πέτραν ἱερὰν ἤγηντο.

ζ. τὰς μετὰ ταύτην πέτρας νομίζουσιν ἐναγεῖς (unholy, accursed).

η. φασὶ ἐπὶ τοῦ συμβάντος ἀρχμοῦ (drought) ὕσαντά τε ἀφεῖναι τὸν Δία.

θ. Εὐρυσθέα φεύγοντα ἐκ τῆς Ἀττικῆς ἀποθανεῖν ὑπὸ Ἰολάου λέγουσιν.

ι. Εὐμηλός φησιν Ἐφύραν Ὠκεανοῦ θυγατέρα οἰκῆσαι ἐν τῇ Κορινθίᾳ γῆ.
